application for admission checklist

We're pleased that you're considering applying to the University of Wisconsin-Sheboygan. This Application Checklist will help you in completing your application in an efficient and timely manner. If you have questions, please contact the Office of Student Services at (920) 459-6633.

admissions Complete and return the UW Application for Undergraduate Admission form to the Office of Student Services. Students are highly encouraged to apply online at www.apply.wisconsin.edu.

\$44 application fee This fee is required of first-time applicants to the UW; if you have been enrolled as a degree-seeking student at a UW Colleges 2-year campus previously, this fee is not required. Make your check payable to UW-Sheboygan.

high school & any college transcripts If you are a high school student, take your completed application and the \$44 application fee to the guidance office. Your counselor will see that your transcript is sent to us. If you are out of high school, simply contact your high school to have a transcript forwarded to us; it should be sent directly from the school to UW-Sheboygan.

If you have been enrolled at other colleges/universities, you must also have those transcripts forwarded directly to UW-Sheboygan. Contact the Registrar's Office at former institutions to accomplish this; normally the request must be in writing and may require a small fee.

act assessment Participate in the ACT assessment and include UW-Sheboygan (Code 046950) as one of the institutions to receive score reports. This is a required part of the admission process. Students 21 years or older can have this requirement waived. For more information, visit www.actstudent.org.

pre-enrollment checklist

placement assessment The UW System requires placement assessment in English and mathematics. Assessment results are used in the advising process. These have no bearing on admission. **THERE IS AN ASSESSMENT FEE.** Assessment information will be mailed to you after we receive an application from you. (See reverse side).

advising & registration for new students Once you have been accepted to UW-Sheboygan and have taken the Mathematics and English Placement Assessments, you will sign up for a New Student Advising and Registration Session. Sessions for fall registration begin in May and sessions for spring registration begin in December. Sessions last approximately two hours, during which you will select courses, under the guidance of advisors, and receive important academic information.

new student orientation New students take part in New Student Orientation during the summer before classes begin for fall term or in January before classes begin for spring term.

classes start Fall term begins in September. Spring term begins in January. Terms are 16 weeks in length (15 weeks of instruction; one week of exams).

financial aid checklist Financial considerations are an important part of college. To assure that you receive any financial benefits for which you may be eligible, be sure that you **APPLY** and that you apply **EARLY!** Here is a checklist to assist you.

financial aid application Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Worksheets are available through high school guidance offices or from UW-Sheboygan. You should apply electronically by using the electronic FAFSA. (Be sure your computer has a compatible browser.) The Web site address is: <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov>. This is the only site you should use...other sites may have a fee attached.

Use the previous year's federal income tax information. If possible, do **NOT** complete a Financial Aid Application based on **ESTIMATED** income information. If you have questions, please contact Financial Aid/Student services at (920) 459-6633.

file early File your FAFSA by the priority application deadline of April 15, if possible. We encourage you to file your application two to three weeks prior to this date. Processing could take a total of two to three months.

save all information Keep a complete file of all financial aid papers! Whenever you receive requests for further information, act immediately. When you receive your Student Aid Report (SAR), or your actual Financial Aid Award Offer, contact the Financial Aid/Student Services Office at UW-Sheboygan.
